

Hi, this is Mayor John Coiro with an update.

As of June 18, we continue to have 307 Totowa residents who have been confirmed testing positive for the corona virus. This is the same figure I reported to you as of June 11 and represents the first week where Totowa has not seen one confirmed positive case. I certainly hope this trend continues. We will need to keep up the good work with the preventive measures you are all taking as the restrictions in NJ continue to ease. In Passaic County, the total confirmed positive has passed 19,000 and the County rate is also easing.

Effective Monday, June 22, the COVID-19 County testing site at William Paterson University will cease operations. Instead, the County will be offering saliva tests. Totowa residents can order these saliva tests through the Passaic County website or drive to the mobile test site at Passaic Valley High School on June 29 from 9AM-3PM to be administered the saliva test. There are also other mobile sites throughout the county on various dates. Check the Totowa website for details. Testing is free to Passaic County residents.

I am happy to announce that our summer concert series sponsored by the Board of Recreation will return beginning Wednesday June 24 at 7pm in front of the municipal building. Social distancing is required. Please see our website and facebook page for details.

Also, beginning Monday June 22, our fields and basketball courts will re-open but we cannot reopen the playgrounds yet. Social distancing will be required.
