MINUTES OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL

February 25, 2025

Mayor John Coiro called the meeting to order and asked the Municipal Clerk to call the roll.

Municipal Clerk Wassel recited the Prayer of the Meeting followed with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag with the public participating.

Mayor Coiro asked the Clerk to read the statement of the meeting.

Municipal Clerk Wassel read the following statement: This meeting of the Mayor and Council held on this day is being held in accordance with Chapter 231, P.L. 1975 of the State of New Jersey as amended. The agenda for this meeting has been prepared and distributed to the Mayor and Council and a copy has been on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

There was a motion by Councilman D'Angelo, seconded by Councilman Picarelli to dispense with the regular order of business in order to hold a public hearing on the 2025 Passaic County Open Space and Farmland Preservation Trust Fund grant application for the installation of upgraded playground equipment and rubberized safety surface at the Kennedy Park Playground and on Ordinance No. 03-2025 as advertised. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

Municipal Clerk Wassel announced that the 2025 Passaic County Open Space and Farmland Preservation Trust Fund grant application for the Kennedy Park Playground Project and Ordinance No. 03-2025 have been advertised for public hearing for Tuesday, February 25, 2025.

Municipal Clerk Wassel read the Open Space Public Hearing Notice.

There was a motion by Councilman D'Angelo, seconded by Councilman Picarelli to open the public hearing. On roll call vote, all members of the Council present voted in the affirmative.

RESOLUTION NO. 31-2025

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A GRANT APPLICATION
TO THE PASSAIC COUNTY OPEN SPACE, FARMLAND
AND HISTORIC PRESERVATION TRUST FUND FOR THE
KENNEDY PARK PLAYGROUND PROJECT
BY THE BOROUGH OF TOTOWA

WHEREAS, the Passaic County Board of County Commissioners (hereafter "Board") provide grants to municipalities and qualified non-profit corporations for the assistance in acquisition, development, stewardship and historic preservation from the Passaic County Open Space, Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust Fund (hereafter "Trust Fund"); and

WHEREAS, the BOROUGH OF TOTOWA desires to further the public interest by obtaining funding in the amount of \$250,000 from the Board for the County to fund the KENNEDY PARK PLAYGROUND PROJECT at a cost of \$275,552; and

WHEREAS, the Board shall determine if the application is complete and in conformance with the scope and intent of the Trust Fund program and the rules and regulations established pursuant to R20170349, and any subsequent Resolutions passed by the Board governing the administration of the Trust Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOROUGH OF TOTOWA AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The MAYOR OF THE BOROUGH OF TOTOWA is authorized to make application, provide all required information and documents as required, and correspond as necessary for a grant to the Passaic County Open Space, Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust Fund.
- 2. That the MAYOR OF THE BOROUGH OF TOTOWA is hereby authorized to execute a grant agreement and any amendment thereto with the County of Passaic for the KENNEDY PARK PLAYGROUND PROJECT.
- 3. That, if the funds provided by the County are less than the total project cost specified above, the applicant has the balance of funding necessary to complete the project.
- 4. That, the applicant agrees to comply with all applicable federal, State, County, and local laws, rules, and regulations in its performance of the project.
- 5. That this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

Municipal Clerk Wassel read the legal notice and the title of Ordinance No. 03-2025.

RESOLUTION NO. 32-2025

RESOLUTION APPOINTING SPECIAL TAX APPEAL COUNSEL AND AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF REVERSE TAX APPEALS

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa requires the services of an attorney to represent the Borough of Totowa as Special Tax Appeal Counsel for the purpose of handling certain reverse real estate tax appeals; and

WHEREAS, the professional services to be provided by Special Tax Appeal Counsel include but are not limited to reviewing all property classes, making appeal recommendations for properties that are substantially under-assessed, and performing all professional services necessary for filing reverse tax appeals which are designed to accurately and equitably apportion the real estate tax burden among the existing properties within the Borough of Totowa; and

WHEREAS, the professional legal services shall be awarded as a non-fair and open contract pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5; and

WHEREAS, the term of this contract shall commence on the date of this Resolution and terminate on December 31, 2025; and

WHEREAS, Special Tax Appeal Counsel shall be entitled to compensation on a contingent fee basis if any increase in assessment occurs as a result of the reverse tax appeal; and

WHEREAS, Special Tax Appeal Counsel shall be responsible for all fees and costs associated with the filing and prosecuting any reverse tax appeal; and

WHEREAS, the value of services to be provided by Special Tax Appeal Counsel under its' contingent-fee arrangement may exceed the value of \$17,500.00; and

WHEREAS, Charles E. Blau, Esq., Blau & Blau, Attorneys at Law, 223 Mountain Avenue, Springfield, New Jersey 07801, is an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, Charles E. Blau, Esq. shall be required to complete and submit a Business Entity Disclosure Certificate which certifies that Blau & Blau, Attorneys at Law, have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the Borough of Totowa in the previous one year, and that the contract will prohibit Blau & Blau, Attorneys at Law from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby authorize the Borough of Totowa to enter into a contract with Charles E. Blau, Esq., Blau & Blau, Attorneys at Law, to serve as the Borough of Totowa Special Tax Appeal Counsel and provide professional legal services.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Municipal Council of the Borough of Totowa does hereby authorize the Mayor and Municipal Clerk to execute any and all necessary instruments relating thereto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Business Entity Disclosure Certification shall be placed on file with this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that no appropriation of funds is required at this time with payment to Special Tax Appeal Counsel coming from the proceeds of any successful tax appeals.

RESOLUTION NO. 34-2025

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE INSTALLATION OF THERMOPLASTIC RUMBLE STRIPS ON WILLARD AVENUE

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa Police Chief has requested that thermoplastic rumble strips be purchased and installed on Willard Avenue; and

WHEREAS, rumble strips are a traffic calming measure that are used to reduce vehicle speed by creating a noticeable vibration and audible noise when driven over thereby alerting drivers to the need to slow down; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa Police Chief has advised that they have been very effective in reducing speeds due to their immediate feedback mechanism; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa have determined that there is need for these thermoplastic rumble strips which will remind drivers of their speed, can encourage them to slow down and reduce speeding violations; and

WHEREAS, Denville Line Painting, Inc., 2 Green Pond Road, Rockaway, New Jersey 07866 has submitted a proposal for the purchase and installation of six (6) sets of thermoplastic rumble strips in the amount of \$3,348.00, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Borough of Totowa Municipal Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa desire to authorize the purchase and installation of thermoplastic rumble strips for the aforementioned reasons; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the applicable New Jersey State laws, the purchase and installation of thermoplastic rumble strips may be authorized without public bidding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby authorize the purchase and installation of thermoplastic rumble strips from Denville Line Painting, Inc. in the amount of \$3,348.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Municipal Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby authorize the Municipal Clerk and Police Chief to execute any and all instruments relating thereto.

RESOLUTION NO. 35-2025

RESOLUTION APPROVING ADJUSTED WATER BALANCE CREDIT AND WAIVING OF INTEREST FOR WALID A. & GEHAN MAHMOUD, 24 LOOKOUT POINT TRAIL

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa Water Department bills its customers based on three cycles, four times a year; and

WHEREAS, the Cycle 1, 2023 Period 3, 2023 Period 4 and 2024 Period 1 meter readings came in at 304,000, 209,000 and 342,000 gallons respectively, which resulted in higher than normal water bills; and

WHEREAS, the owner, Walid Mahmoud disputed the billings claiming that the meter had to be defective because he didn't have any water leaks; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa swapped out his old water meter with a new one and thereafter the meter readings were more in line with the norm; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa can adjust the meter readings for the 2023 Period 3, 2023 Period 4 and 2024 Period 1 meter readings to 104,000, 32,000 and 30,000 gallons respectively based on historical averages for those periods; and

WHEREAS, the owner, Walid Mahmoud has requested a credit based on the adjusted meter readings for the billing periods in question along with the waiving of any interest; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have agreed to the adjusted water balance credit and the waiving of interest; and

WHEREAS, the Water Registrar is now requesting permission to do a balance adjustment on the water account and to waive off interest fees to date.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa do hereby approve the request and authorize the Water Registrar to make the necessary adjustments to the account.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa that the Borough Clerk send a copy of this resolution to the Water Registrar.

RESOLUTION NO. 39-2025

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING REIMBURSEMENT TO THE BOROUGH OF WOODLAND PARK FOR EMERGENCY REPAIRS TO THE SHARED 24" SANITARY SEWER FORCE MAIN

WHEREAS, emergency repairs were made to the shared 24" sanitary sewer force main utilized by the Township of Little Falls, Borough of Totowa and Borough of Woodland Park and located on McBride Avenue in Woodland Park; and

WHEREAS, these repairs included but were not limited to emergency stabilization, utilizing the Jet-Vac to clean pipe access hole; power washing the fittings to locate leaks; setting up the confined space permit; ventilating the chamber and setting up the blower; locating, removing and replacing all damaged valves, fittings and hoses; cleaning the site and demobilizing the area; and

WHEREAS, the repairs were performed on October 23, 2024 and October 24, 2024 by Montana Construction, 80 Contant Avenue, Lodi, New Jersey 07644 at a total cost of \$9,747.53; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Woodland Park paid for the costs incurred to repair the shared 24" sanitary sewer force main; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an agreement previously entered into by the three (3) municipalities, the cost of this repair project shall be split between the municipalities on a pro rata basis with the allocation of costs set at 32.3% for Little Falls, 36.9% for Totowa and 30.8% for Woodland Park; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Woodland Park has now invoiced the Borough of Totowa for their share of the costs for emergency repairs in the amount of \$3,596.84; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Totowa desire to authorize net payment in the amount of \$3,596.84 to the Borough of Woodland Park for the above repairs.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa supports Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (Federal Fair Housing Law) and the New Jersey Law Against Discrimination; and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Borough of Totowa to implement programs to ensure equal opportunity in housing for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, ancestry, sex (including pregnancy), national origin, nationality, familial status, marital or domestic partnership status, affectional or sexual orientation, atypical hereditary cellular or blood trait, genetic information, liability for military service, mental or physical disability, perceived disability, AIDS/HIV status and Lawful Income or Source of Lawful Rent Payment (Section 8); and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Totowa further objects to discrimination in the sale, rental, leasing, financing of housing or land to be used for construction of housing, or in the provision of brokerage services because of race, color, religion, ancestry, sex, national origin, handicap or disability as prohibited by Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (Federal Fair Housing Law) and the New Jersey Law Against Discrimination.

- 1. Within available resources, the Borough of Totowa will assist all persons who feel they have been discriminated against under one of the aforementioned categories, to seek equity under federal and state laws by filing a complaint with the New Jersey Division on Civil Rights and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, as appropriate.
- 2. The Borough of Totowa shall publicize this resolution and through this publicity shall cause owners of real estate, developers, and builders to become aware of their respective responsibilities and rights under the Federal Fair Housing Law, the New Jersey Law Against Discrimination, and any local laws or ordinances.
